

The Employment Exchanges also present useful Labour Market Information for policy planning and research purposes. The details of educational, vocational, and other qualifications of jobseekers registered with the Employment Exchanges provide an extensive source of data at national as well as local levels for employers and policy makers. While the State Governments compile this data at the District and State level, the Directorate General of Employment (DGE) compiles and publishes the data at the national level.

- 2 This publication, the 26th in the series, presents annual time series data on various fields of activities of the Employment Exchanges such as registration, placement, live register, submission and so on. Efforts have been made to keep the publication as up-to-date as possible.

HIGHLIGHTS

The present report is based on the information collected through various statistical returns of different periodicity from Employment Exchanges located across the country. Some of the key findings are highlighted below:

A) Employment Exchanges

- ❖ There were 1005 employment exchanges, including 76 University Employment Information and Guidance Bureau (UEI&GB), functioning in the country in the year 2022.
- ❖ Among 1005 employment exchanges, 42 were special employment exchanges for differently abled persons and 38 were special cells dealing with differently abled in the year 2022.
- ❖ There were 14 employment exchanges for professional and executive (P&E) and 5 employment exchanges were exclusively for women in the year 2022.

B) Registration

- ❖ Around 40.0 lakh jobseekers have got registered in employment exchanges during 2022.
- ❖ Out of the total registered jobseekers, around 25.0 lakh jobseekers were men and 15.0 lakh were women.
- ❖ During 2022, the highest jobseekers were in Kerala (5.1 lakh) followed by Maharashtra (4.9 lakh), Tamil Nadu (4.8 lakh) and Uttar Pradesh (4.0 lakh).
- ❖ The educated jobseekers registered in employment exchanges were 36.2 lakh and out of which 13.4 lakh were women.
- ❖ Around 7.1 lakh Scheduled Caste jobseekers registered in employment exchanges out of which 6.8 lakh were educated jobseekers.
- ❖ Around 2.4 lakh Scheduled Tribe jobseekers registered in employment exchanges out of which 2.2 lakh were educated jobseekers.
- ❖ The number of differently abled jobseekers registered in employment exchanges was around 28.3 thousand out of which 902 jobseekers registered in special employment exchanges during 2022.

- ❖ The number of minority community's jobseekers, viz., Muslim, Christian, Sikh, Buddhist and Jain registered in employment exchanges were 145.4 thousand, 95.2 thousand, 22.0 thousand, 16.2 thousand and 0.6 thousand, respectively.

C) Placement

- ❖ Around 6.4 lakh jobseekers were placed through employment exchanges during the year 2022.
- ❖ Out of the total placed jobseekers, around 5.2 lakh were men and 1.2 lakh were women.
- ❖ During the year 2022, around 4.6 lakh educated jobseekers were placed, whereas the number of educated women placed through employment exchanges was around 89 thousand.
- ❖ During the year 2022, around 38.7 thousand Scheduled Caste, 22.0 thousand Scheduled Tribe and 17.6 thousand Other Backward Class jobseekers were placed through employment exchanges.

D) Live Register

- ❖ Around 457.2 lakh jobseekers were registered on the live register of employment exchanges in the country at the end of December 2022. Out of which 163.0 lakh were women.
- ❖ Out of total jobseekers, around 292.1 lakh jobseekers were youth (upto 29 years) which constitute 63.9% of total jobseekers.
- ❖ Around 365.7 lakh jobseekers on live register were educated and out of which, around 160.4 lakh were educated women jobseekers during the year 2022.
- ❖ Among educated jobseekers on live register, around 63.4 lakh were Scheduled Caste and 26.6 lakh were Scheduled Tribe.
- ❖ The jobseekers belong to Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Other Backward Class registered on live register of employment exchange across the country were 72.8 lakh, 30.2 lakh and 122.2 lakh at the end of the December, 2022.
- ❖ During the year 2022, the differently abled jobseekers registered on live register in the country were around 7.0 lakh.
- ❖ Total jobseekers belong to minority communities registered on live register were

58.7 lakh at the end of December, 2022.

E) Vacancies Notified

- ❖ Total numbers of vacancies notified during the year 2022 (January to December) were 13.7 lakh in which the vacancies notified for SC were 18.5 thousand, 8.7 thousand for ST and 4.5 thousand for OBC.

F) Submission Made

- ❖ The submission made by the employment exchanges was around 26.4 lakh in the country at the end of December, 2022.

CHAPTER 1

FRAME WORK FOR DATA COLLECTION

1.1 Introduction

National Employment Service in the country functions in the legal framework of Employment Exchange (Compulsory Notification of Vacancies) Act, 1959 through a network of Employment Exchanges located in various parts of the country. The services rendered by the Employment Exchanges include registration and placement, vocational guidance and career counseling and collection of Employment Market Information, etc. National Employment Service covers all the States and Union Territories with a network of 1005 Employment Exchanges (*Except Sikkim, as no employment exchange in the State*). Administrative and financial control of Employment Exchanges lies with the respective State/UT Government. As part of their administrative functioning, Employment Exchanges collect data on various aspects of employment and unemployment and supply to the respective State Directorate of Employment and the Directorate General of Employment (DGE). State Government are required to compile this data at the State level, while Directorate General of Employment (DGE) compiles and releases this data at all India level. Directorate General of Employment is responsible for laying down the policies, standards, norms and guidelines for coordination of the National Employment Service at all India level. In this publication, data on jobseekers registered with the Employment Exchanges has been analyzed to give the employment and unemployment scenario in the country.

1.2 Reference Period

Employment Exchanges furnish data through various returns known as Employment Exchange Statistical Returns, covering various fields viz., registration, placement, live register, submissions made and vacancies notified etc. at different periodicity. The data presented in the report refer to the year 2022 (from 1st January to 31st December). There are 3 annual, 4 half-yearly and 1 monthly return. Name and brief description of Statistical Returns are as follows:

1.3 Concepts and Definitions

Some of the important terms, relevant to the administrative records generated in the Employment Exchanges are mentioned below:

Applicant	A person who voluntarily registers at an employment exchange and is eligible for employment and other assistance in accordance with the prescribed procedure.
Apprentice	A person who is undergoing apprenticeship training in a trade in pursuance of a contract of apprenticeship.
Apprentices Act	The Apprentices Act, 1961, provides for the regulation and control of training of apprentices in trades and matters connected therewith.
Dead Register	Systematic arrangement of Index Cards of applicants who for various reasons are not entitled to placement assistance.
Displaced Person	A person who, on account of the setting up of India and Pakistan or on account of civil disturbances or fear of such disturbances in any area which formed part of the erstwhile Pakistan had been displaced from or left his place of residence in such an area after 1 st day of March, 1947, and who has subsequently been residing in India (Government of India Ordinance No. XX of 1948). Where, however, State Government has evolved a system of registration of Displaced Persons only those persons who are in possession of evidence if such registration should be regarded as "Displaced Persons" by Employment Exchanges for purposes of employment under that State.
Differently Abled	A person who on account of injury, disease or congenital deformity is substantially handicapped in obtaining or keeping employment or in undertaking work on his own account of a kind which apart from the injury, disease or deformity would be suited to his age, experience and qualifications.
Educated	A jobseeker who is having qualification of the level of 10 th standard and above.
Group Discussion	A discussion with a homogenous group of applicants or students involving detailed information on job opportunities, training facilities and such other matters pertaining to career planning or choosing appropriate to the group.
Group Guidance	All group activities conducted for guidance purposes.
Index Card	A card on which particulars pertaining to and action in respect of an applicant are recorded.
Live Register	Systematic arrangement of Index Cards pertaining to applicants who are in need of employment assistance.

Placement	An employer's acceptance of a person into a remunerative job through the Employment Exchange. This includes: acceptance by employers of applicants submitted by Exchanges for training/apprenticeship with the object of their becoming paid employees on completion of their training/apprenticeship.
Registration	The process of recording the particulars of an employment seeker according to prescribed procedure with a view to render him employment assistance.
Registration Guidance	Brief counseling given to an applicant at the time of registration.
Submission	Forwarding of applicant's particulars to an employer for consideration against a notified, advertised or speculative vacancy.
Vocational Guidance	Assistance given to an individual in solving problems related to vocational planning and to occupational choice and profession with due regard for the individual characteristics and their relation to occupational opportunities.
Renewal of Registration	The process of extension of the period for which registration is valid for purposes of rendering employment assistance.

1.4 Limitations of Data

Data flowing from the Employment Exchanges suffers from some limitations. These limitations arise out of the fact that the Employment Exchanges are mostly located in urban areas. The jobseekers from the rural areas may find it difficult to register their names with the Employment Exchanges. Further, the registration of applicants with the Employment Exchanges is voluntary in nature. The following limitations of the data may be kept in view while using the information contained in the publication:-

- ❖ The jobseekers registered with the Employment Exchanges may not necessarily be unemployed.
- ❖ In some cases, there may be a chance of duplication of registration.
- ❖ The jobseekers, after getting employment from other sources except Employment Exchanges, don't intimate the Employment Exchanges for deletion of their names from the Live Register.
- ❖ Employers don't always intimate the Employment Exchanges about the selection of candidates even when selection is made from the list supplied by Employment Exchanges.
- ❖ There can be cases when jobseekers could not renew their cards within the stipulated period and by virtue of their non-renewal, their names get deleted from the live register.

1.5 National Career Service Portal

The Ministry of Labour and Employment is implementing National Career Service (NCS) Project as a Mission Mode Project for transformation of the National Employment Service to provide a variety of employment related services like career counseling, vocational guidance, information on skill development courses, apprenticeship, internships etc. Under this project, the NCS Portal (NCSP) has been made functional at the URL (www.ncs.gov.in). The services under NCS are available online and can be accessed directly, through Career Centres, Common Service Centres, post offices, mobile devices, cyber cafes etc. The various stakeholders on the NCS platform include jobseekers, industries, employers, employment exchanges (career centres), training providers, educational institutions and placement organizations.

The NCS Project also envisaged setting up of Model Career Centres (MCCs) to be established in collaboration with States and other institutions to deliver employment services. The Government has approved establishment of 407 Model Career Centres. The Government provides financial assistance to these centres based on the proposals and scheme guidelines. These Model Career Centres can be replicated by the States from their own resources. In addition, the NCS project has a component of interlinking of employment exchanges with NCS portal and provides central funding to States for up-gradation of infrastructures in employment exchanges and organizing Job fairs.

Statistics given in this publication are exclusively received through employment exchanges of State/UTs in the country. The jobseeker's data available on National Career Service Portal (NCSP) is not included in this report. *“For data of jobseekers registered on NCS portal please refer to report section of www.ncs.gov.in”* (https://www.ncs.gov.in/_layouts/15/ncsp/ViewStaticReport.aspx).

CHAPTER 2

EMPLOYMENT EXCHANGE STATISTICS: AN ANALYSIS

The Chapter includes the Employment Exchange Statistics pertaining to the year 2022. The jobseekers registered with the Employment Exchanges in the country has been classified according to several variables such as age, gender, education level, etc. and analyzed with a view to understand the labour market information. The report is based on the responses received from around 80% employment exchanges across India for the reference period.

2.1 JOBSEEKERS

Employment Exchanges provide the various services viz., registration of jobseekers and their placement, providing vocational guidance and career counseling, etc. Live Register is a systematic arrangement of Index Cards pertaining to applicants/jobseekers who is in need of employment assistance. Live Register, therefore, provides the total number of persons waiting for job as on a particular day.

Statement 1 shows the number of registration, placement, vacancies notified, submission made and live register in the employment exchanges at All India level during the period 2017 to 2022.

The followings are the Salient features of registration and placement in Employment Exchanges:

- ❖ During 2022, 457.2 lakh jobseekers were on live register with employment exchanges as compared to 440.7 lakh during 2021.
- ❖ The number of jobseekers on live register was increased by 3.7% during 2022 as compared to the year 2021.
- ❖ The jobseekers registration has increased to 40.0 lakh during 2022 from 32.2 lakh during 2021, registered a growth of 24.0%.
- ❖ The placement has increased to 6.4 lakh in 2022 from 4.9 lakh in the year 2021.
- ❖ The number of vacancies notified during the year 2022 was around 13.7 lakh which was 8.2 lakh during 2021.

Figure 1 shows the year-wise trend of jobseekers on live register since 2010 to 2022. It reflects that the highest number of jobseekers on live register was 482.6 lakh during the year 2014. During 2022, around 457.2 lakh jobseekers were on live register of employment exchanges.

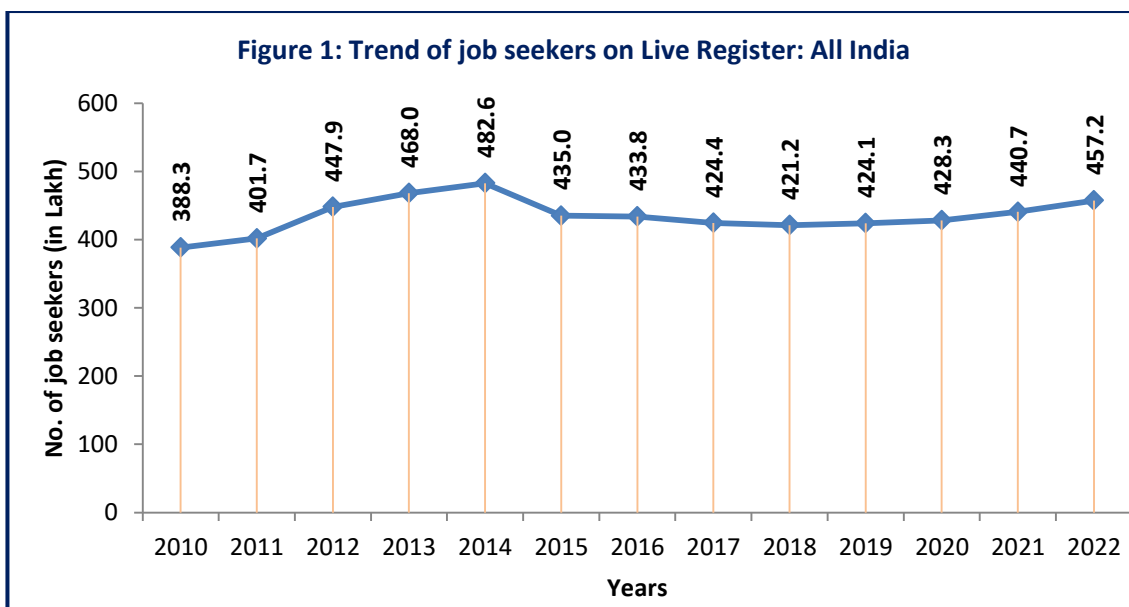
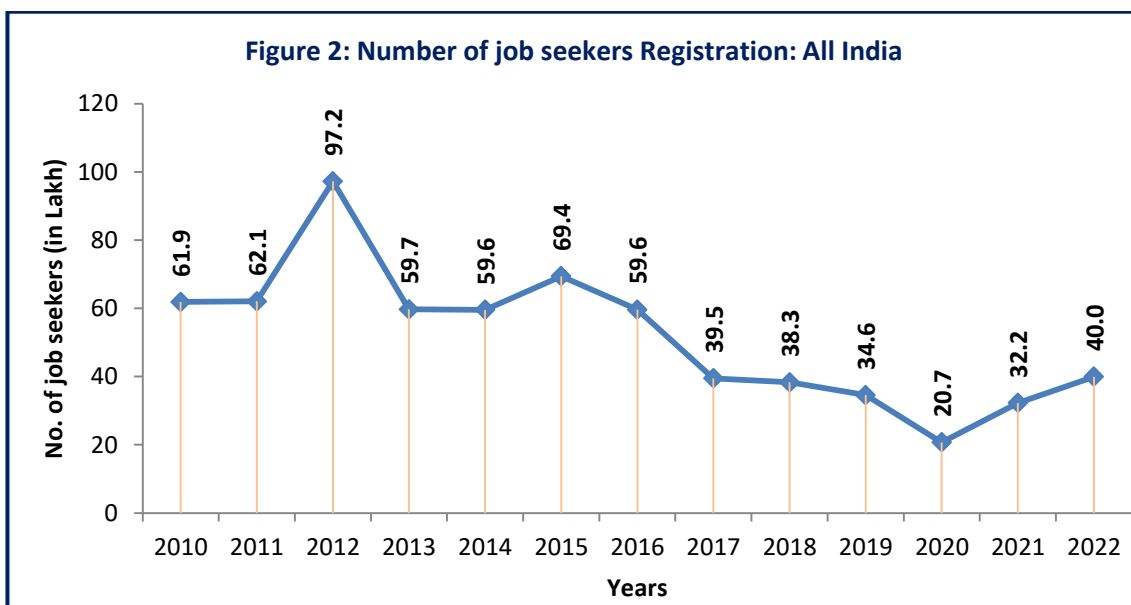


Figure 2 shows the year-wise number of jobseekers registration in employment exchanges since 2010 to 2022. It reflects that the highest number of jobseekers registration was 97.2 lakh during the year 2012 and during the subsequent years it has fluctuating trend. During 2022, the total number of jobseekers registration was 40.0 lakh as compared to 32.2 lakh during 2021.



The time series data on number of jobseekers registered with the Employment Exchanges, placement effected against the vacancies notified, along with the number of jobseekers on Live Register, submissions made for the period 2010 to 2022 are given at **Table 1**.

STATE-WISE JOBSEEKERS

The State-wise statistics of jobseekers registration, placement, submissions made, vacancies notified, live register, etc. with employment exchanges for the year 2022 is given at **Table 2**.

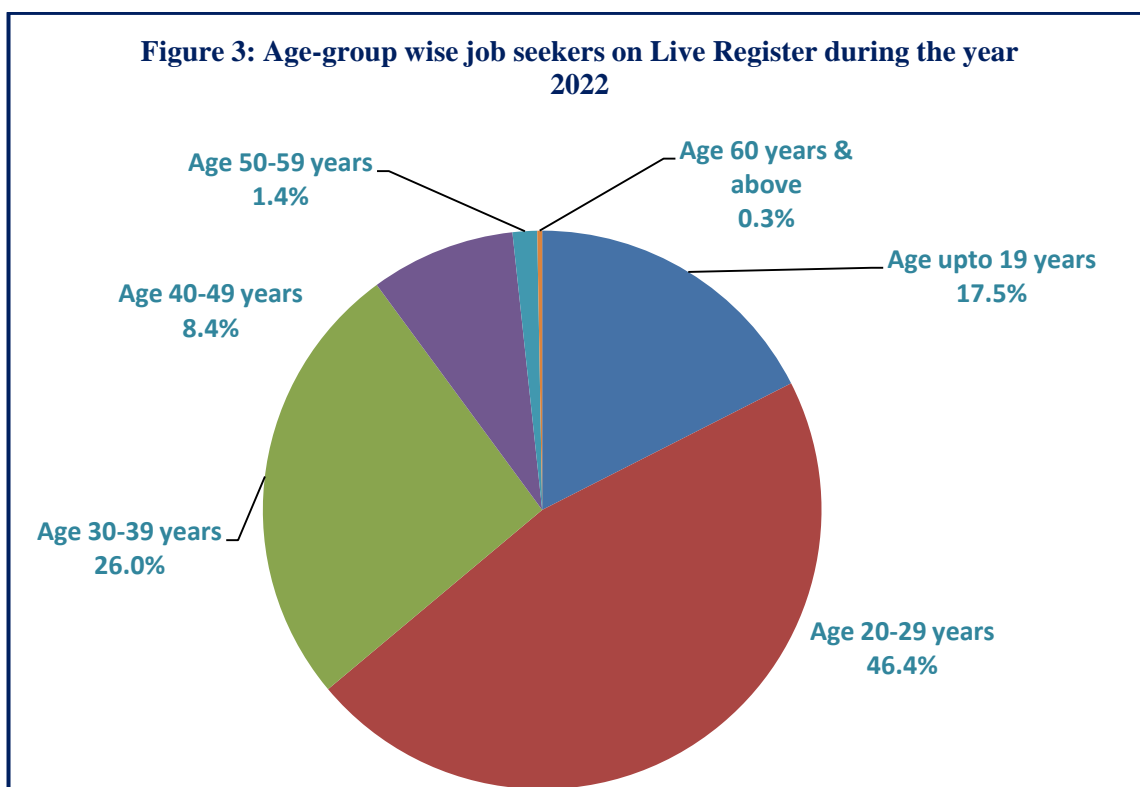
The followings are the salient features:

- ❖ The highest number of jobseekers registered during 2022 were in Kerala (5.1 lakh) followed by Maharashtra (4.9 lakh), Tamil Nadu (4.8 lakh) and Uttar Pradesh (4.0 lakh).
- ❖ The largest number of jobseekers on live register during the year 2022 were in West Bengal (77.6 lakh), Tamil Nadu (67.8 lakh) and Maharashtra (58.8 lakh).
- ❖ During the year 2022, more than 8.5 lakh vacancies were notified by Maharashtra which was the highest among all State/UTs followed by Gujarat with 3.6 lakh.
- ❖ Around 26.4 lakh jobseekers were sponsored by the employment exchanges and out of these 6.4 lakh got the placement.
- ❖ During the year 2022, Gujarat has placed 2.7 lakh jobseekers that were the highest among all State/UTs followed by Maharashtra with 2.5 lakh.

2.2 AGE-WISE DISTRIBUTION OF JOBSEEKERS

Age-wise distribution of jobseekers on the live register for the years 2011 to 2022 are given at **Table 3**. State-wise number of jobseekers on the live register for various age-groups during the year 2022 is given at **Table 4**.

Figure 3 shows the percentage distribution of jobseekers on live register for various age-groups during the year 2022. The highest number of jobseekers were registered on the live register were for the age group of 20-29 years during the year 2022.



The followings are the salient features of age-wise distribution of jobseekers on live register over the years:

- ❖ Around 63.9% of the jobseekers were upto age 29 years during the year 2022.
- ❖ The number of jobseekers in the age group of 20-39 years was 283.8 lakh, which was 70.6% of total jobseekers on live register during 2011 which has increased to 72.4% in 2022 depicting 331.0 lakh jobseekers.
- ❖ The number of jobseekers on live register in the age group of 30 years & above has increased to 165.0 lakh during 2022 as compared to 132.8 lakh during the year 2011.
- ❖ The percentage of jobseekers in the age group of 30 years & above to the total number of jobseekers on live register was 36.1% during 2022.

2.3 EDUCATED JOBSEEKERS (10th Standard & above)

The major share of jobseekers awaiting jobs in the employment exchanges was that of educated persons. The year-wise registration, placement and live register, etc. of educated jobseekers are given at **Table 5**.

Statement 2 shows the number of registration, placement and live register for educated jobseekers along with the percentage share of educated jobseekers on live register to the total number of jobseekers on live register.

It shows that around 36.2 lakh educated jobseekers got registered with the employment exchanges during the year 2022. The percentage of educated jobseekers on live register to the total live register has decreased from 81.3 % during 2017 to 80.0% during the year 2022. Out of the total placement of 6.4 lakh jobseekers during 2022, 4.6 lakh was educated jobseekers.

Figure 4 shows the year-wise trend of educated jobseekers on live register since 2010 to 2022. It reflects that the highest number of educated jobseekers on live register was 404.0 lakh during the year 2014. During the year 2022, the number of educated jobseekers on live register was 365.7 lakh.

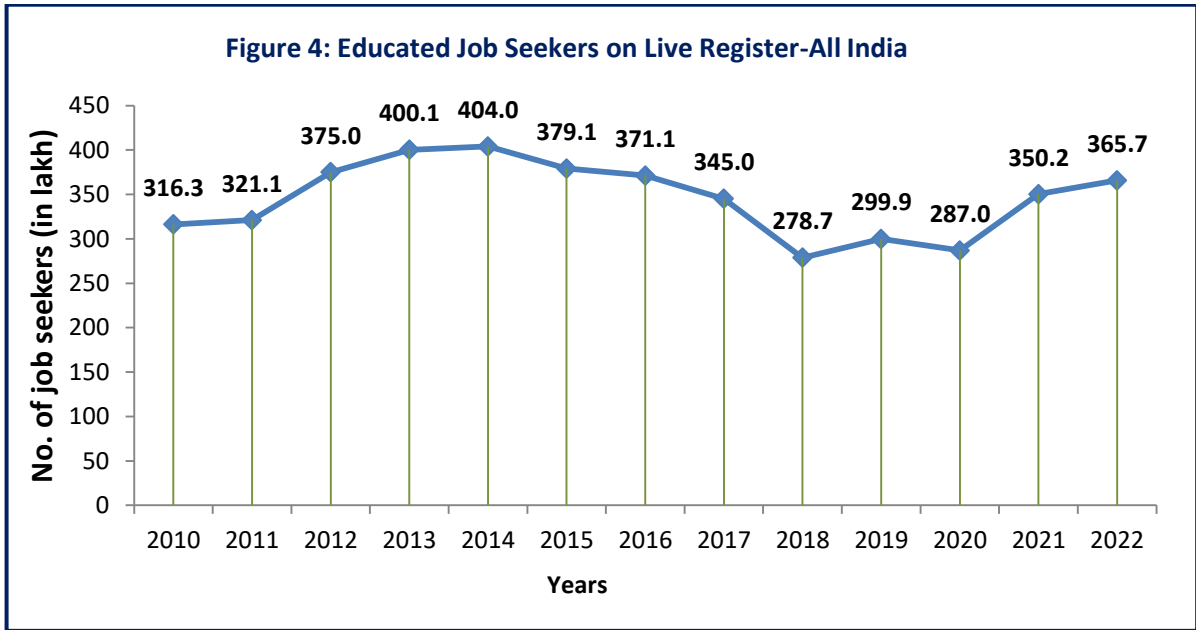
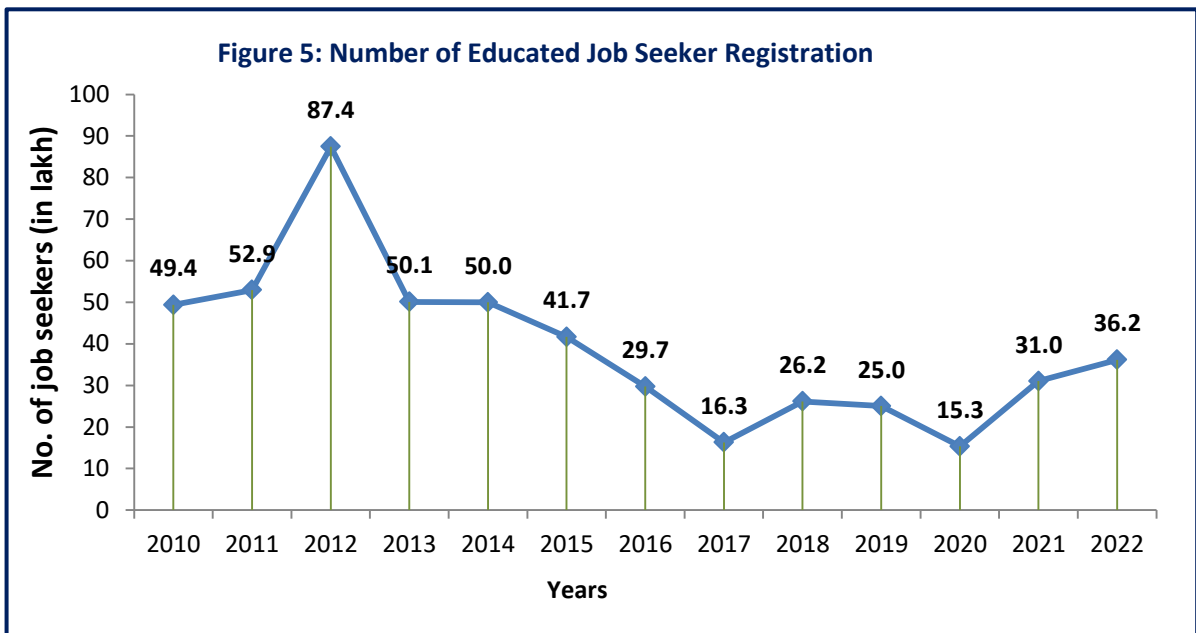


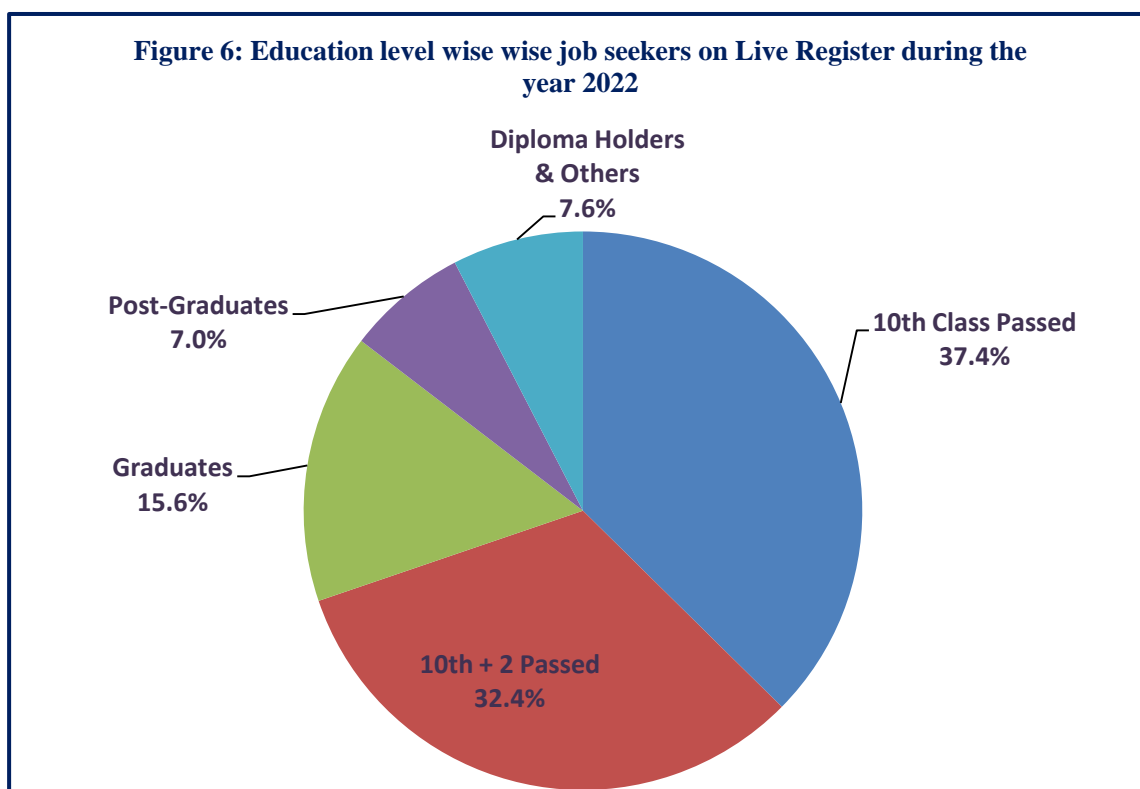
Figure 5 shows the year-wise number of educated jobseeker registration in employment exchanges since 2010 to 2022. It reflects that the highest number of educated jobseekers registration was 87.4 lakh during the year 2012 and in the subsequent years it has fluctuating trend. During the year 2022, the number of educated jobseekers registration was 36.2 lakh.

The number of educated jobseeker registered on live register of employment exchanges according to various education levels for the year 2022 is given in **Table 6**.

Figure 6 shows the percentage distribution of educated jobseekers on live register by various education level during the year 2022. Among the educated jobseekers, the highest jobseekers on the live register were 10th class passed, with share of 37.4%.



The followings are the main findings:

- ❖ The maximum number of jobseekers was educated upto 10th standard level with 37.4% share in total educated jobseekers.
- ❖ Higher Secondary or 12th passed accounted for 118.4 lakh (32.4%), Graduates, Post-Graduates and Diploma Holders & Others were 57.2 lakh (15.6%), 25.6 lakh (7.0%) and 27.8 lakh (7.6%), respectively.
- ❖ The educated women jobseekers were 43.8% of the total educated jobseekers on live register during 2022. Among the total educated jobseekers, 64.5 lakh women were 10th class passed, 52.3 lakh were 12th passed, 26.0 lakh were Graduates and 10.4 lakh were Post-Graduates. The educated women having education level of Diploma holders & others were 7.2 lakh during the year 2022.

2.4 WOMEN JOBSEEKERS

Statement 3 shows the number of registration, placement, live register (LR) in respect of women jobseekers at All India level during the years 2017 to 2022.

The data in the above **Statement 3** shows that

- ❖ Women jobseekers constituted around 35.6% of the total live register in 2022 as compared to 35.9% during 2021.
- ❖ The number of women jobseekers on live register has slightly increased during 2022 as compared to the previous year.
- ❖ Registration of women jobseekers has increased to 15.0 lakh during 2022 from 13.3 lakh during the previous year 2021.
- ❖ The placement of women jobseekers through employment exchanges has increased to 1.23 lakh during the year 2022 against 0.81 lakh during 2021.

Figure 7 shows the year-wise trends of women jobseekers on live register during the years 2010 to 2022.

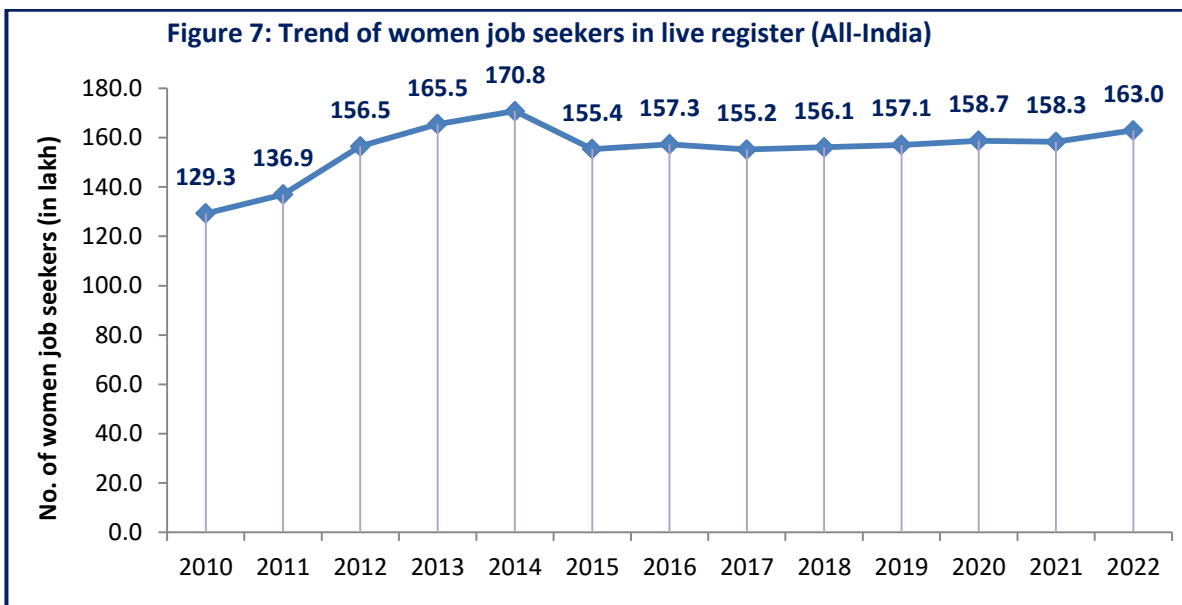
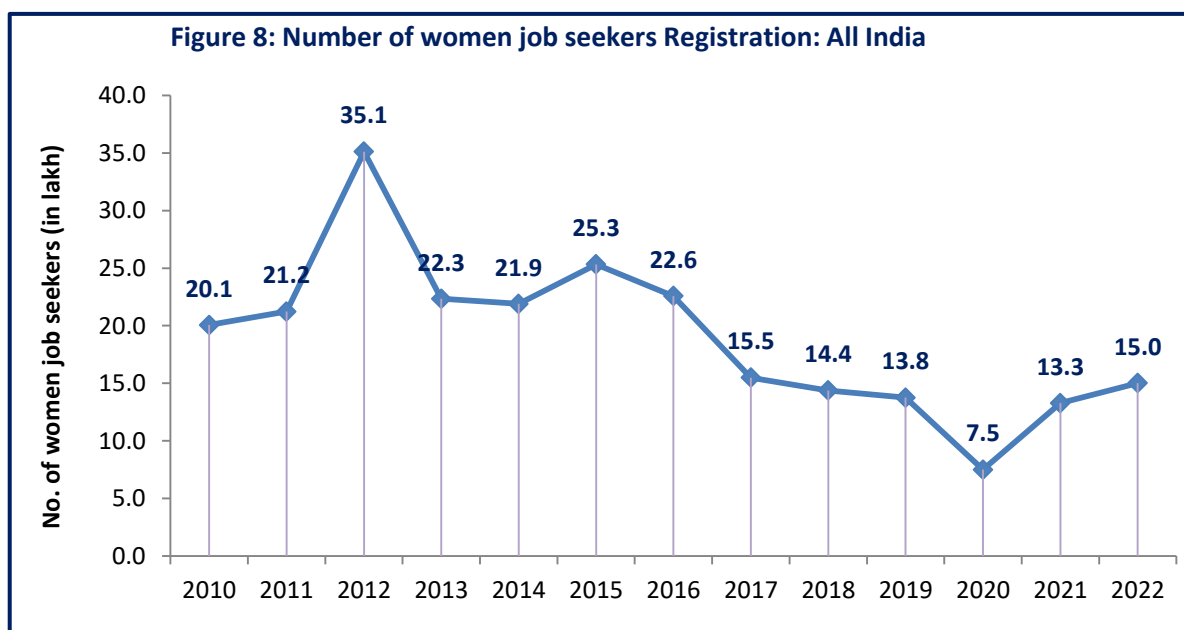

It reflects that the highest number of women jobseekers registration was 35.1 lakh during the year 2012 and in the subsequent years it has fluctuating trend. During 2022, the total women jobseekers registration was 15.0 lakh.



The detailed statistics on registration, placement, live register of women jobseekers through employment exchanges for the period 2010 to 2022 is given at **Table 7**.

Table 8 represents the State-wise statistics on women jobseekers in respect of registration, placement, live register, etc. The main highlights are as follows:

- ❖ Among the major states, Tamil Nadu had the highest number of women jobseekers (36.1 lakh) on live register of employment exchanges followed by West Bengal (24.6 lakh) and Maharashtra (18.9 lakh).
- ❖ The highest number of women jobseekers who got registered in employment exchanges in the country during 2022 were in Kerala (3.2 lakh) followed by Tamil Nadu (2.6 lakh) and Maharashtra (1.4 lakh).
- ❖ Around 1.2 lakh women jobseekers were placed through employment exchanges across the country and 52.2 thousand women jobseekers were placed by Maharashtra.

EDUCATED WOMEN JOBSEEKERS

The details on number of registration, placement, live register of educated women jobseekers through employment exchanges for the period 2010 to 2022 is given at **Table 9**.

Figure 9 shows the year-wise trend of educated women jobseekers on live register since 2010 to 2022. It reflects that the highest number of educated women jobseekers on live register was 160.4 lakh during the year 2022.

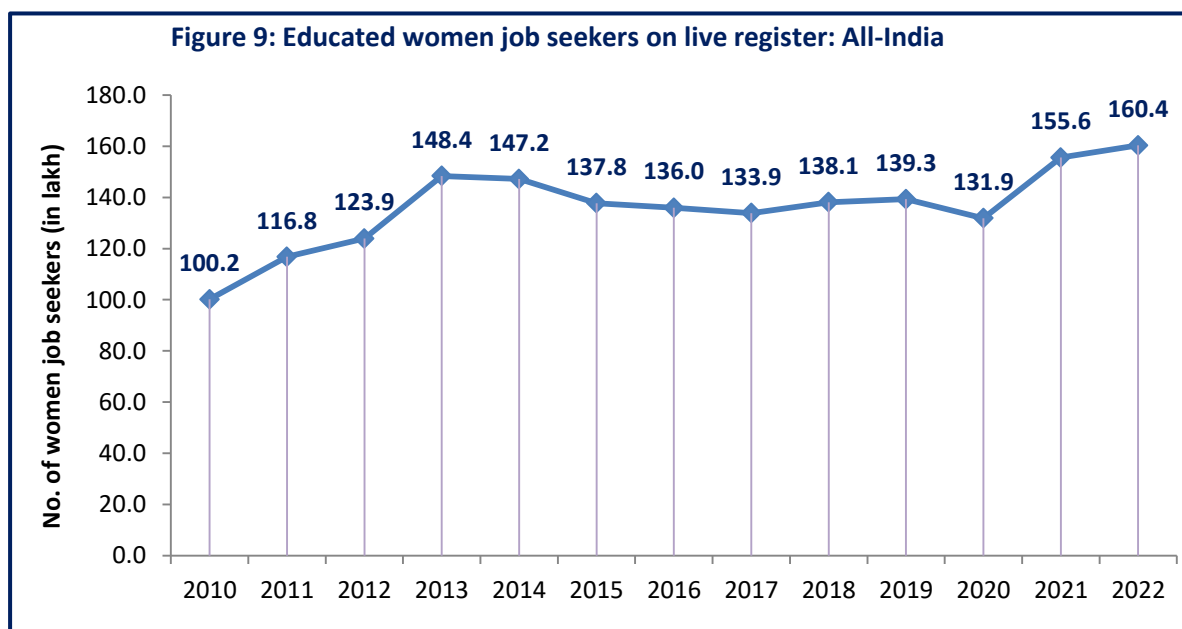


Figure 10 shows the year-wise number of educated women jobseeker registration in employment exchanges since 2010 to 2022. It reflects that the highest number of educated

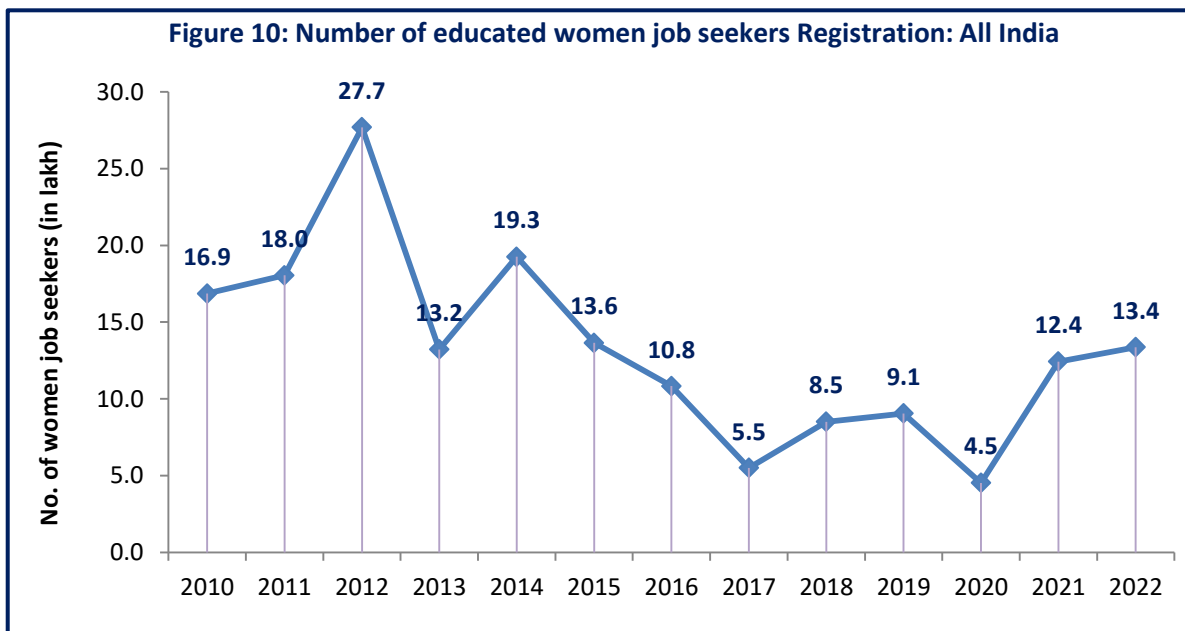
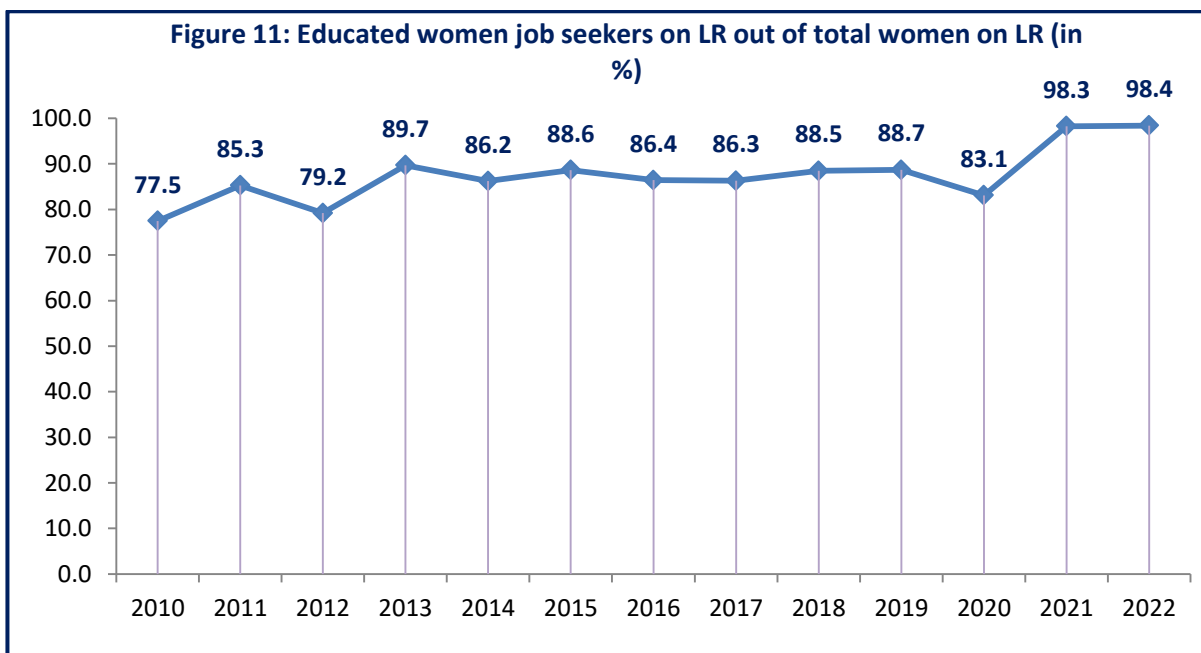

2.5 CATEGORY WISE JOBSEEKERS

The employment service, as in the past, continued making efforts to cater to the special needs of Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST) and Other Backward Classes (OBC) jobseekers. Over the years, a number of special measures were adopted by the employment exchanges to safeguard the interest of the jobseekers belonging to these categories. These includes:

- ✚ Maintenance of their registration cards separately
- ✚ Ensuring the vacancy notifications from public sector establishments invariably indicating details regarding reservation
- ✚ Providing vocational guidance and imparting recruitment training
- ✚ Sponsoring suitable candidates against unreserved vacancies
- ✚ Eliciting the cooperation of SC and ST association in locating suitable candidates.

SCHEDULED CASTE JOBSEEKERS

The year-wise statistics of registration, placement and live register, etc. in respect of Scheduled Caste jobseekers are given at **Table 10. Statement 4** shows the number of registration, placement, live register (LR) in respect of SC jobseekers at All India level during the years 2017 to 2022.

The data in the above Statement 4 shows that

- ❖ Over the period 2017 to 2022, live register of SC jobseekers has increased from around 71.1 lakh in 2017 to 72.8 lakh in 2022, showing an increase over the period.
- ❖ SC jobseekers were 15.9% of the total jobseekers on the live register at the end of year 2022.

- ❖ Registration of SC jobseekers has increased to 7.1 lakh during the year 2022 against 3.6 lakh during the previous year 2021.
- ❖ During 2022, placement of SC jobseekers has increased to around 39 thousand as compared to 26 thousand during previous year.

Figure 12 shows the year-wise trends of SC jobseekers on live register during the years 2010 to 2022.

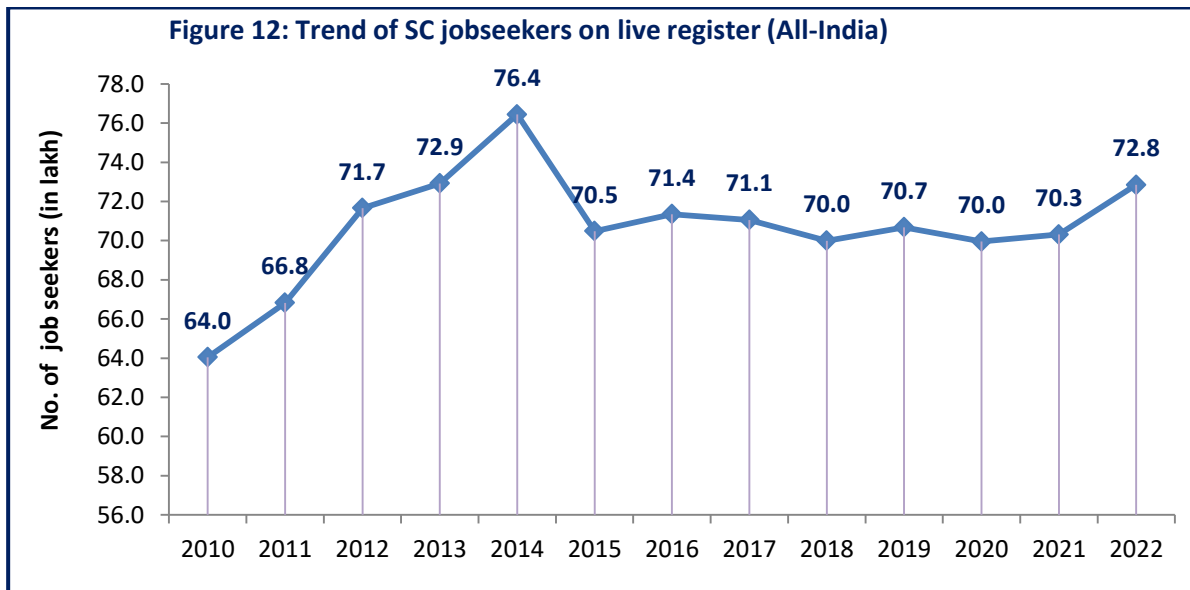
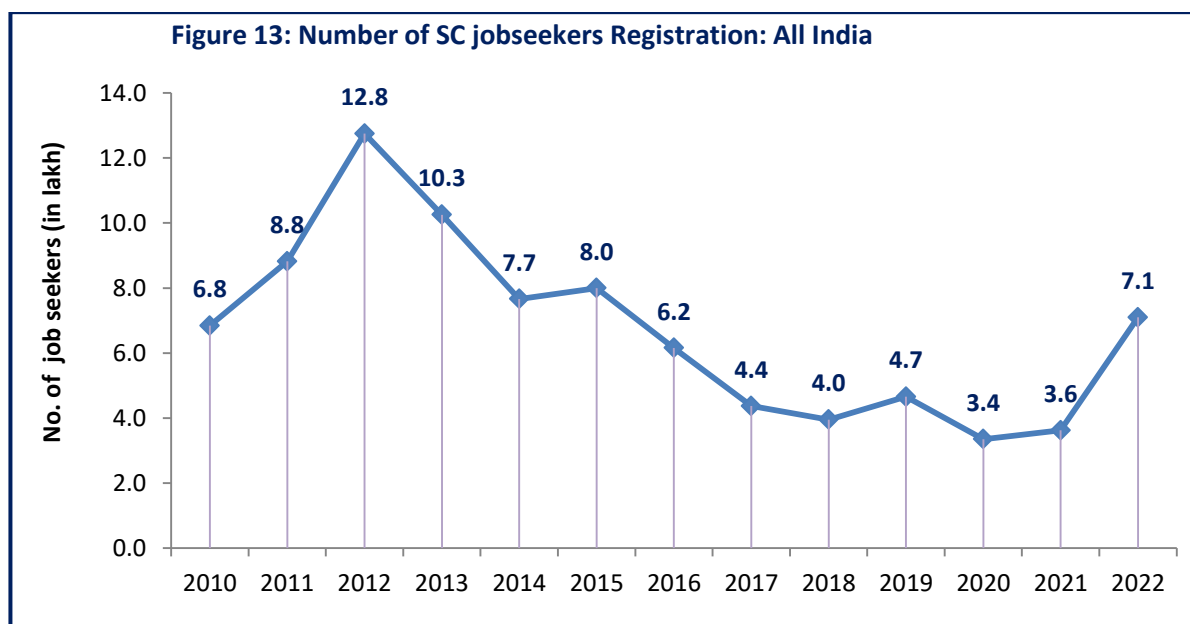

EDUCATED SCHEDULED CASTE JOBSEEKERS

The year-wise statistics of employment exchanges in respect of educated Scheduled Caste jobseekers is given in **Table 11**.

Figure 14 shows the year-wise number of educated SC jobseeker registration in employment exchanges since 2010 to 2022. It reflects that the highest number of educated SC jobseekers registration was 10.1 lakh during the year 2012. During the year 2022, the educated SC jobseekers registration was 6.8 lakh as compared to 3.5 lakh during 2021.

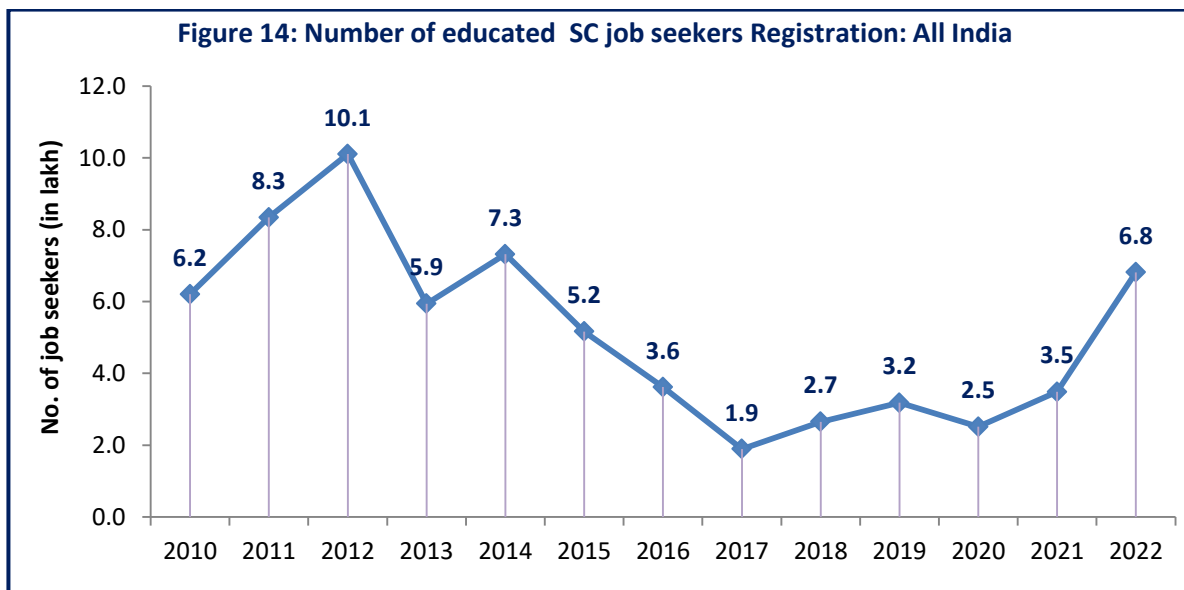
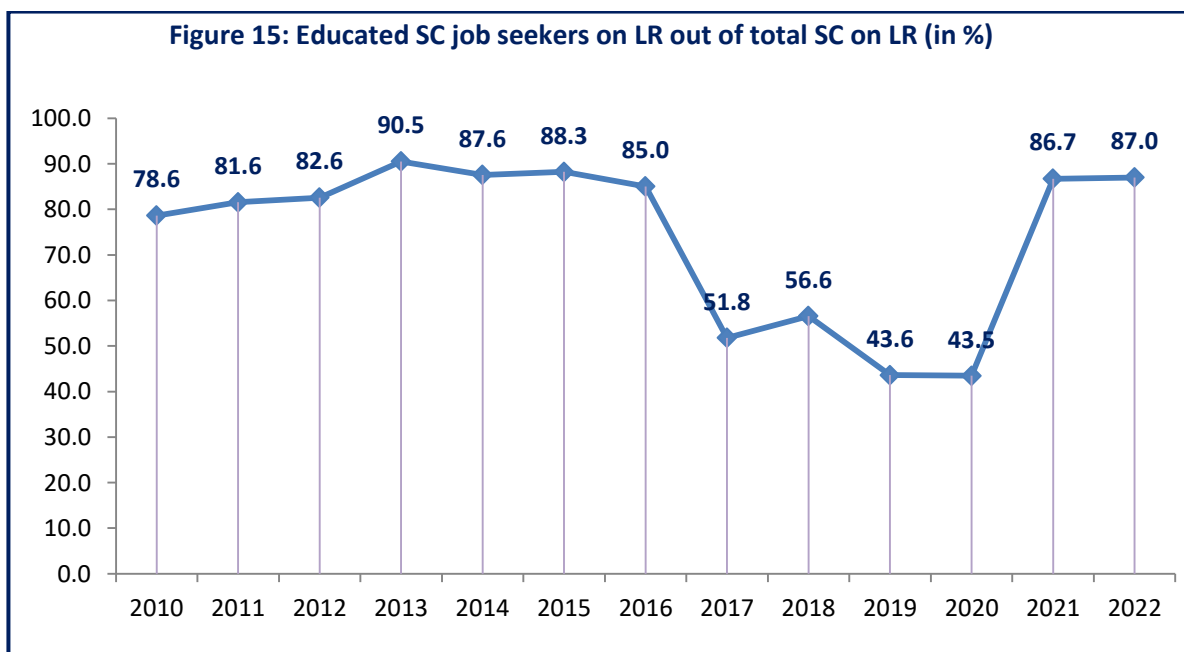


Figure 15 shows the year-wise percentage of educated SC jobseeker on live register out of total SC on live register since 2010 to 2022. It reflects that 87.0% SC jobseekers on live register were educated during the year 2022.



The main highlights of the educated SC jobseekers are as follows:

- ❖ The percentage of educated SC jobseekers to the total SC jobseekers has slightly increased to 87.0% in 2022 as compared to 86.7% in the previous year 2021.
- ❖ Around 38.7 thousand SC jobseekers were placed through employment exchanges during 2022 and out of which, 33.3 thousand were educated.
- ❖ Live register of educated SC jobseekers has been fluctuated between 50.4 lakh to 63.4 lakh during the period 2010 to 2022.

SCHEDULED TRIBE JOBSEEKERS

The year-wise statistics of employment exchanges in respect of Scheduled Tribe (ST) jobseekers is given at **Table 12. Statement 5** shows the number of registration, placement, live register (LR) in respect of ST jobseekers at All India level during the years 2017 to 2022.

- ❖ Live register of ST jobseekers has increased to 30.2 lakh during the year 2022 against 25.4 lakh during the previous year.
- ❖ ST jobseekers were 6.6% of the total jobseekers on the live register at the end of year 2022, which was 5.8% during 2021.
- ❖ Registration of ST jobseekers has increased to 2.4 lakh during the year 2022 as compared to 1.7 lakh during 2021.
- ❖ Placement of ST Jobseekers has increased to 22 thousand during the year 2022 as compared to 20.7 thousand during the previous year 2021.

Figure 16 shows the year-wise trends of ST jobseekers on live register during the years 2010 to 2022.

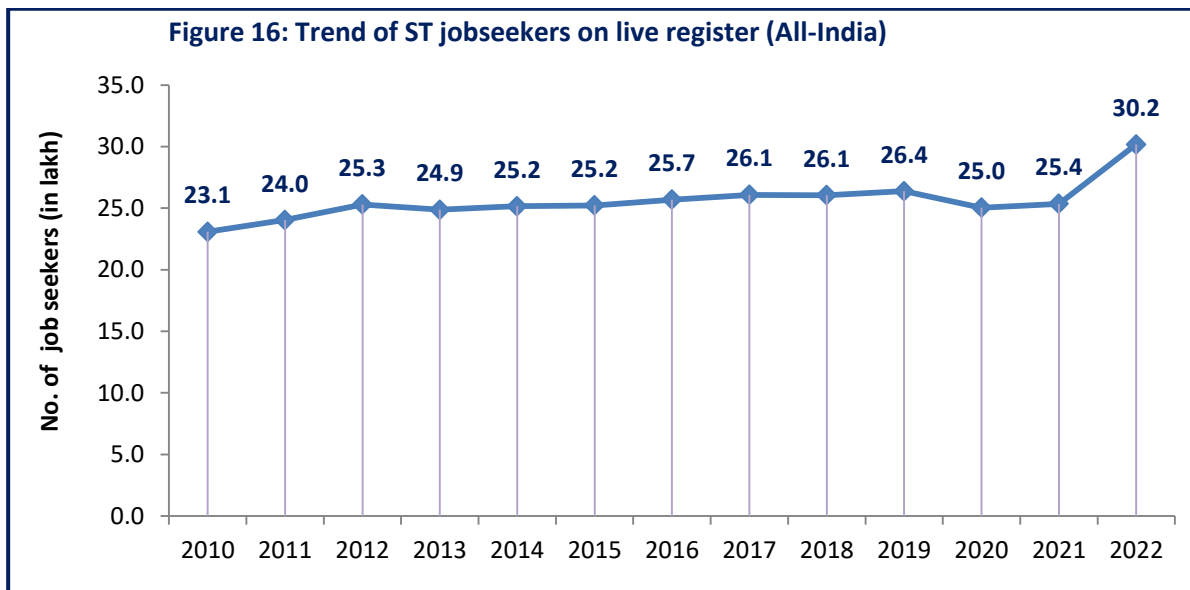
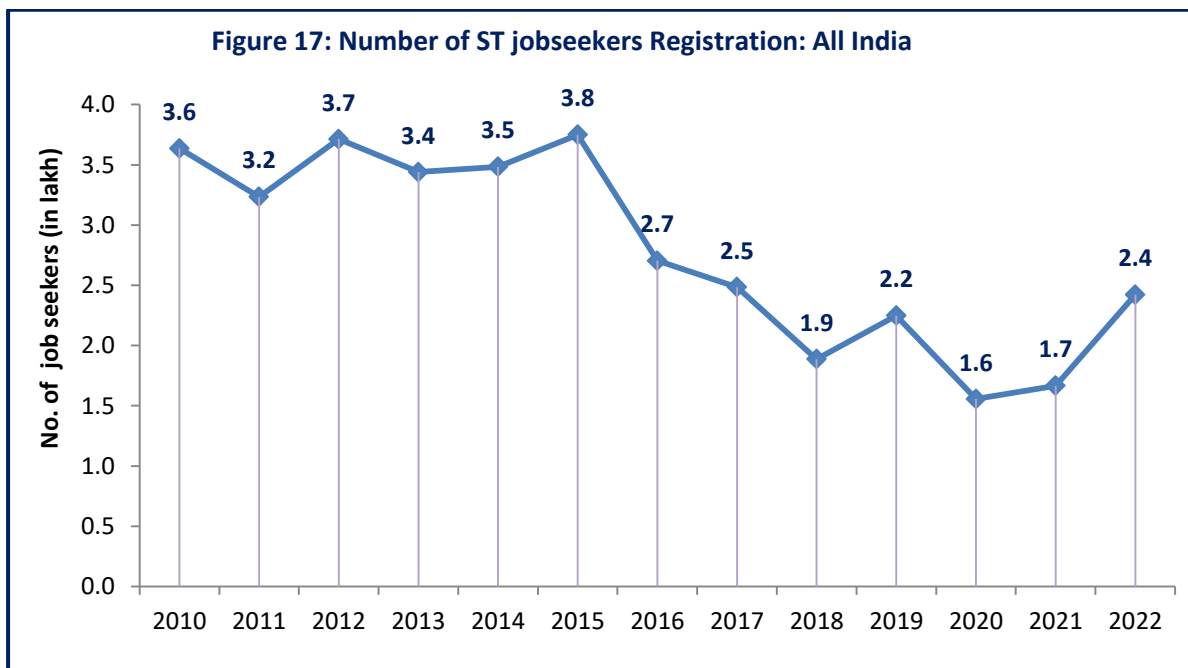

EDUCATED SCHEDULED TRIBE JOBSEEKERS

The year-wise statistics of employment exchanges in respect of educated Scheduled Tribe (ST) jobseekers is given in **Table 13**.

Figure 18 shows the year-wise number of educated ST jobseeker registration in employment exchanges since 2010 to 2022. It shows that total educated ST jobseeker registration was 2.2 lakh during the year 2022 which is the highest number since 2016.

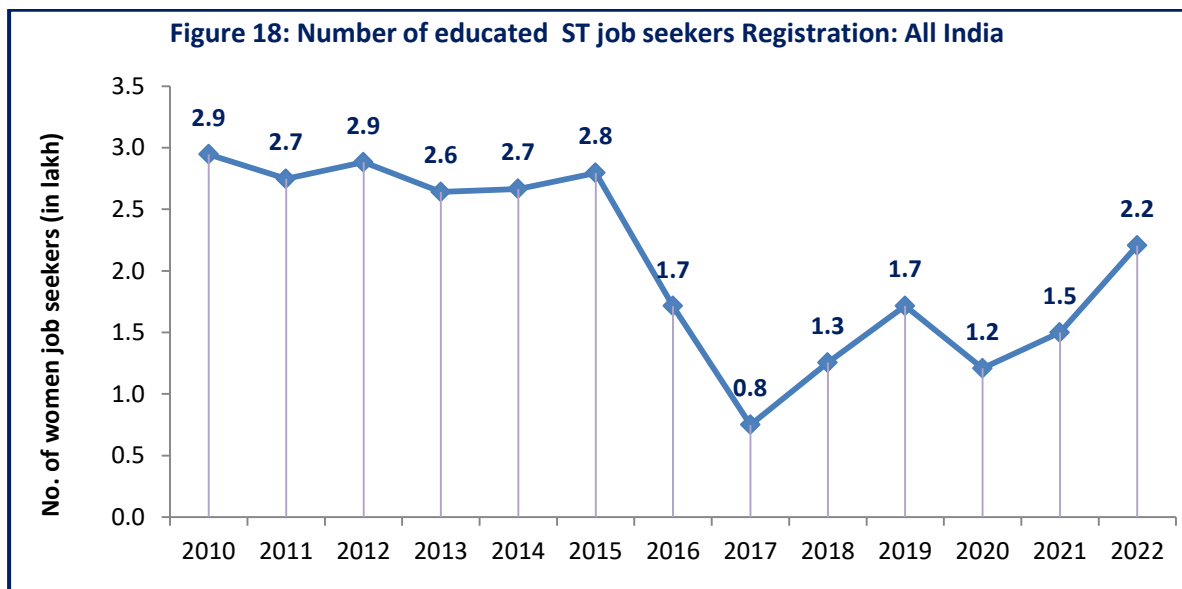
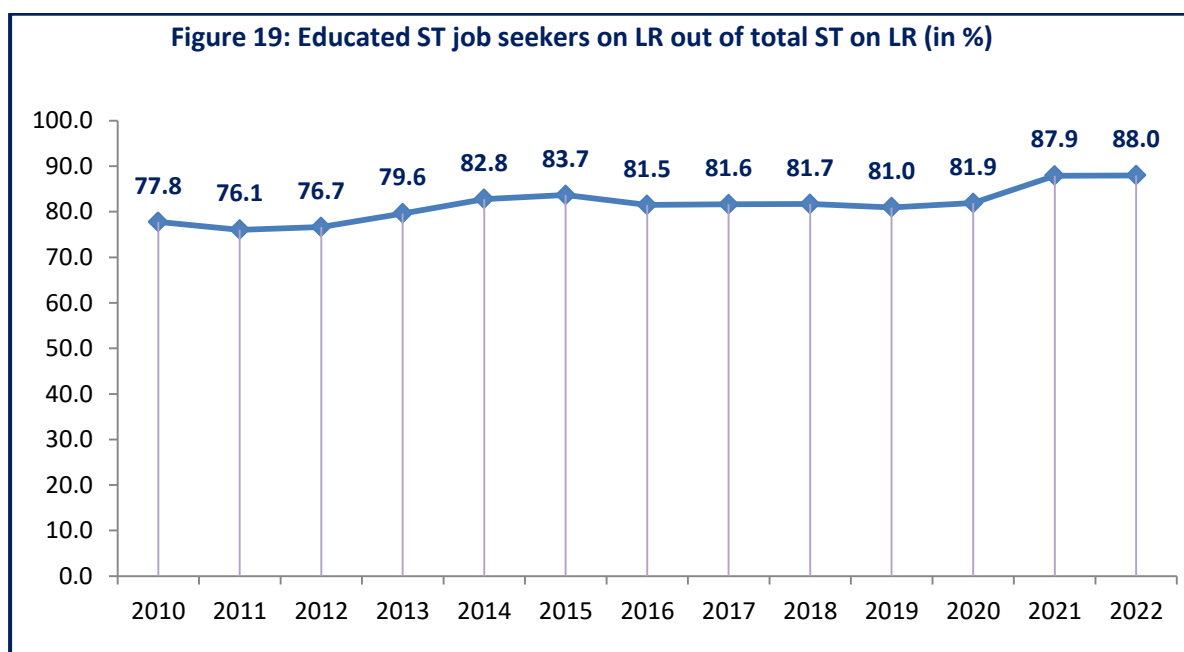

The main highlights of the educated ST jobseekers are as follows:

- ❖ The percentage of educated ST Jobseekers to total ST Jobseekers has increased to 88.0% at the end of the year 2022 as compared to 87.9% in 2021.
- ❖ Around 22 thousand ST Jobseekers were placed through the employment exchanges during the year 2022, and out of which around 18.7 thousand were educated ST jobseekers.
- ❖ Live register of educated ST jobseekers has been fluctuated between 18.0 lakh to 26.6 lakh during the period 2010 to 2022.

STATE-WISE

State-wise details of registration, placement and live register, etc in respect of Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST) and Other Backward Class (OBC) jobseekers for the year 2022 is given in **Table 13-A**.

- ❖ The State-wise table reveals that Tamil Nadu has maximum number of SC, ST and OBC jobseekers around 17.7 lakh, 5.2 lakh and 46.9 lakh on the live register, respectively during the year 2022.
- ❖ Gujarat has placed maximum number of SC and ST Jobseekers around 22.6 thousand and 19.1 thousand respectively, whereas for OBC jobseekers, maximum placement of 12.5 thousand was made in Maharashtra during 2022.

The position of reserved vacancies notified and filled by employment exchanges is given in **Table 14**. The ratio of vacancies filled to vacancies notified for jobseekers of SC, ST and OBC categories was 57.8%, 87.4% and 75.6%, respectively during 2022.

2.6 DIFFERENTLY ABLED JOBSEEKERS

The Employment Service is making all efforts to cater to the special needs of the differently abled jobseekers. At all-India level, there were 42 Special Employment Exchanges working at the end of the year 2022 and Shimla employment exchanges was maintaining duplicate cards only. In addition to these special employment exchanges, there are 38 Special Cells for differently abled jobseekers in the normal Employment Exchanges which are also catering to special employment needs of differently abled jobseekers. Apart from these special cells and exchanges, normal employment exchanges also register the differently abled jobseekers.

Besides these, there are 24 National Career Service Centre for Differently Abled (NCSC-DA) erstwhile Vocational Rehabilitation Centres (VRCs) functioning at Mumbai, Hyderabad, Jabalpur, Delhi, Ludhiana, Kanpur, Calcutta, Chennai, Ahmedabad, Trivandrum, Bangalore, Guwahati, Bhubaneswar, Jaipur, Vadodara, Patna, Agartala, Una, Srinagar, Ranchi, Dehradun, Dimapur, Shillong and Puducherry. These centres are working under the direct administrative control of Directorate General of Employment and evaluate the residual capacity of the differently abled persons, impart them vocational training and guidance and try to put them into the job or self-employment according to their capabilities. NCSC-DA had rehabilitated 7.4 thousand persons during 2022.

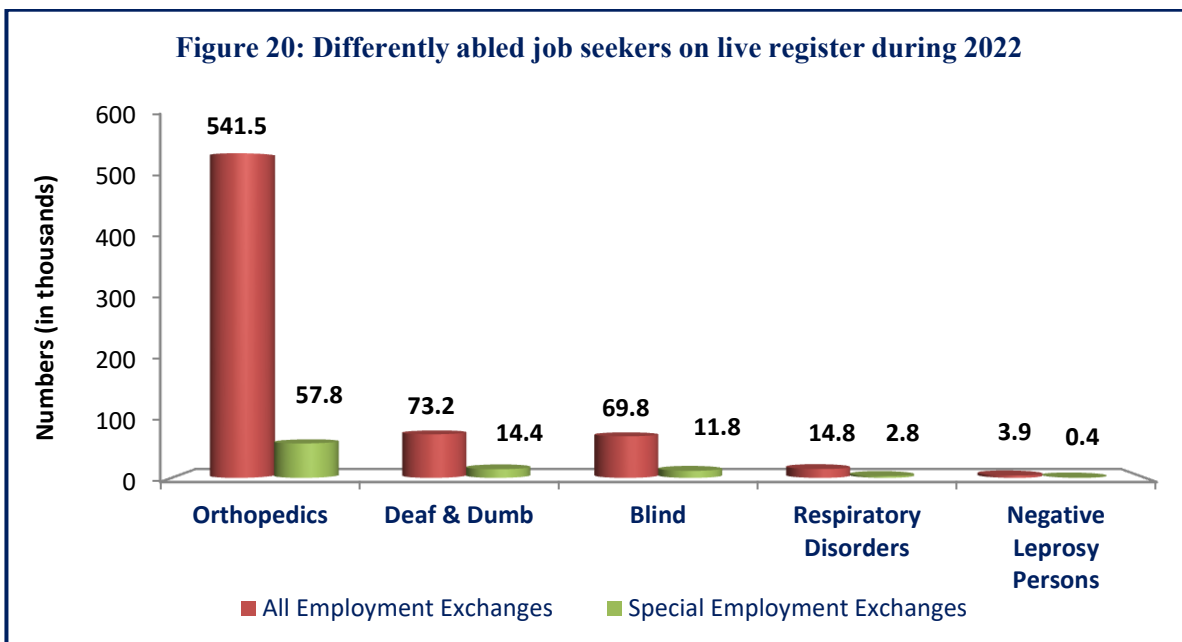

The data in the above statement shows that the number of differently abled jobseekers on live register of all employment exchanges has slightly decreased during the year 2022 as compared to previous year.

The differently abled jobseekers having infirmity of Orthopedics was found to be maximum in number on the live register of employment exchanges followed by deaf & dumb and blind during the year 2022.

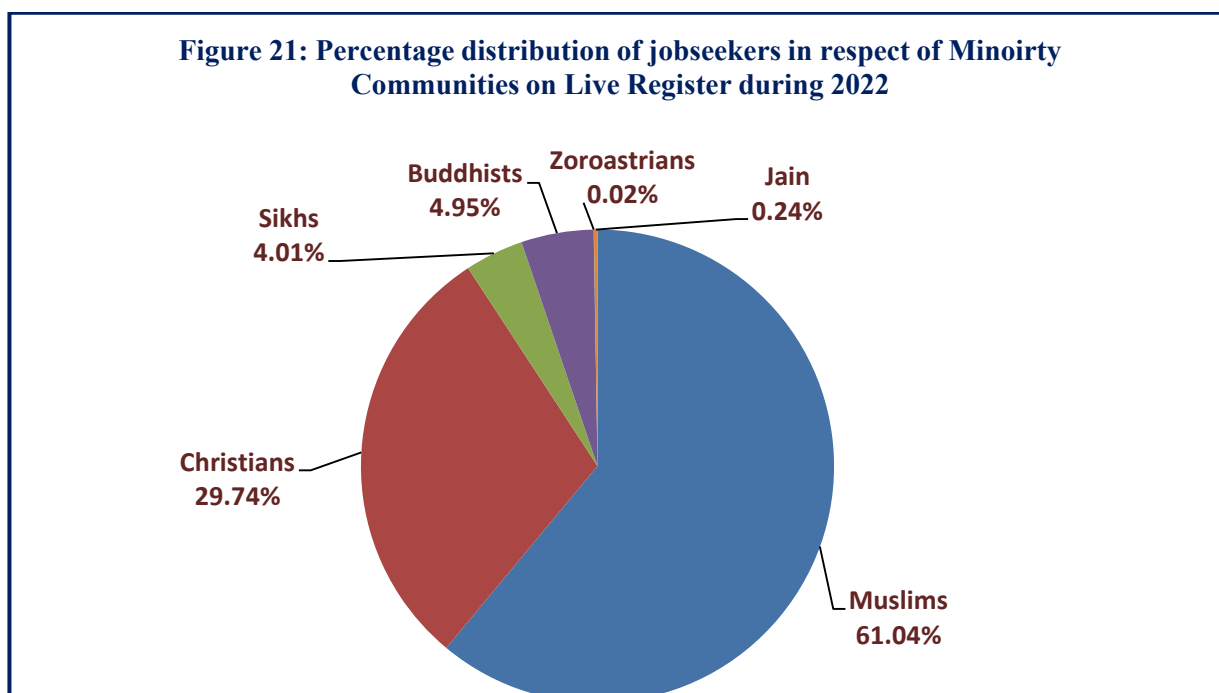
Figure 20 shows the disability wise jobseekers on live register for the year 2022.



2.7 MINORITY COMMUNITIES JOBSEEKERS

The main minority communities in India are Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, Buddhists, Jain and Zoroastrians. The statistics of employment exchanges in respect of Minority Communities is given in **Table 20**. Number of jobseekers belonging to all minority communities put together at the end of 2022 on live register of employment exchanges in India was around 58.7 lakh.

Figure 21 represents the percentage distribution of jobseekers on the live register in respect of minority communities for the year 2022.



The followings are the main highlights in respect of minority community's jobseeker:

- ❖ During 2022, out of total minority communities' jobseekers live register, 35.8 lakh (61.04%) were Muslims, 17.5 lakh (29.74%) Christians, 2.9 lakh (4.95%) Buddhists, 2.4 lakh (4.01%) Sikhs, 14 thousand (0.24%) Jains and Zoroastrians were around 1100.
- ❖ During the year 2022, around 2.8 lakh minority jobseekers got registered with the employment exchanges across India. The maximum registration was made in respect of Muslim jobseekers (1.5 lakh) followed by Christians (0.95 lakh) and Sikhs jobseekers (0.22 lakh).
- ❖ The maximum placement was made in respect of Muslim jobseekers (4.5 thousand).

2.8 EX-ITIs AND FULL TERM APPRENTICES

The statistics of employment exchanges in respect of Ex-ITIs and Full Term Apprentices during the years 2010 to 2022 is given in **Table 21**. The jobseekers who have completed ITI courses and got themselves registered with the employment exchange was around 98 thousand at the end of the year 2022. The Ex-ITI jobseekers placed through the employment exchanges were around 8.3 thousand during the year 2022.

The jobseekers who have completed full term apprentice and got themselves registered with the employment exchange was 6625 during 2022. The full term apprentice jobseekers placed through the employment exchanges were 2848 during the year 2022.

2.9 OCCUPATION -WISE JOB-SEEKERS (NCO 2004)

Number of jobseekers on the live register of employment exchanges classified by broad occupational groups at the end of the year 2022 is given in **Table 22**. It may be seen that out of 457.2 lakh jobseekers on live register of employment exchanges in the country at the end of the year 2022, around 274.8 lakh i.e. the majority of the jobseekers (60.1%) were found to be in the category of workers not classified by any occupation, meaning thereby that the majority of jobseekers were inexperienced, fresher and therefore did not fall under any category of occupation. Second highest jobseekers were in the category of clerks 64.5 lakh (14.1%) followed by Professionals 34.3 lakh (7.5%) and Technician & Associate

Professionals 25.6 lakh (5.6%). The lowest number of jobseekers was belonged to the Occupation Legislators, Senior Officials & Managers. In case of woman job-seekers which were 163.0 lakh in 2022, out of which 106.3 lakh (65.2%) were in the category of workers not elsewhere classified followed by 12.9% in Clerks category.
